**Principal Update - Christine Ahrens**

- Thank you for volunteers for Run-A-Thon!
  - Loved the raffles and organized announcements, culminating in being pied in the face.
  - Incorporating more incentives for next year.
- Fall fest was lots of fun, thank you to everyone who volunteered and our 5th grade gives back for running games.
- Top Timberwolves - First Thursday of each month, one from each classroom. September recognized prepared and on time, October recognized engaged and enthusiastic, November is recognizing gratitude, December will recognize kids who are staying focused.
- Veterans day said pledge and sang the National Anthem in the field. Students wrote letters to those who have served. Thank you to everyone who made it all possible!
- Thank you for food during conferences - Portillos was a big hit with the teachers.
  - Thank you for help with BBQ in partnership with GECRC
  - Thank you for desserts on the last day.
- Thank you for help with field trips, a lot of students are very excited about them. Every grade has identified and scheduled their trips.
- This week Christine has had to reach out to families of students who have searched for things that are not school appropriate - curse words or mental health phrasing. If mental health concerns are flagged they are connected with student support staff.
  - Search is screenshot and then sent to parents - starts with a warning and if it continues they lose Chromebook privileges.
- Map testing coming up as well as ACCESS testing for ESL identified students.
- Staff shout outs - trying to spread positivity and recognize staff. Created a nice culture here, teachers felt it was just what they needed - also started shouting out each other. Gotten a lot of kind words from parents both long and short.
- Thank you for the hard work of the PTA and how PTA meetings are run. Thank you for being active and involved and we love having you at school.

**Guest Speaker - Dee Neukirch - Director of Language Programs**

- Here to provide Language program updates - there are some great updates to all programs, not just dual language. - Dee will provide the slides for viewing.
- Has 20 years of experience all in Spanish and ELL - has a large network of people to reach out to regarding best practice, curriculum, etc.
- Glen Ellyn is unique for the number of language learning opportunities available to students.

- FLES & World Language
  - All FLES teachers have their own classrooms - this has been great for teachers in regards to accessing curriculum, tech, supplies, and they feel as though they can engage their students in learning so much better.
  - Dee has toured all FLES rooms and now has moved on to touring World Language classrooms.
  - World Language teachers are an impressive group of people. Students are developing a high level of language that is unique to the area.
- Seal of Biliteracy
  - Went from 66 students passing to 145 students passing.
  - This test is very difficult.
  - Certification of being bilingual - allows you to bypass the Illinois biliteracy test when becoming bilingual teachers.
- Dual Curriculum Enhancements
  - Dual is using a new literacy curriculum that follows the gen ed literacy
  - Dual students are getting 50/50 spanish and english literacy tied to a researched based curriculum
    - Historically was 70/30 with teachers developing content
  - Two new administrators with significant experience in a combination of dual, ESL, bilingual and language acquisition. Dee and Christine are in constant communication regarding programming
  - We now have a fully dedicated Dual Instructional Coach targeting collaboration, support, and program enhancements.
- ESL Instruction
  - ESL staff are piloting newcomers (new to US with three year period) groups that tailor to those in both Mono and Dual - not just Spanish speaking.
  - All admin team members are seeing targeting towards support for ESL students.
  - Hadley ESL team is implementing a new curriculum which is more tailored to the literacy and language support needs of middle school learners. - Using a program from NatGeo that levels learning to a specific students language acquisition level
  - Glenbard West articulation meetings occurred with Hadley staff - really strong commitment to supporting ESL students in their scheduling in high school
- Continuum of Language Learning
  - D41 has placed a significant level of importance on the diverse language programs. We have significant resources, great staff, awesome students and families.
  - Diverse language programs support all students, not just one group of learners. We are going above and beyond other neighboring districts
  - New administrative team is highly experienced and knowledgeable about language acquisition at the various levels of learning. They are also highly collaborative and committed to continued success and growth of all programs.
- Question regarding Seal of Biliteracy Data - is there a way to break the data down more to divide out FLES students versus dual language students?

- Hoping for further collaboration to be able to get that kind of information from D87.

#### **Churchill Teacher Representatives - Dee Dee Aldrich & Kristen Travers - Presented by Carol Van Gorp**

- Adding some new things - Raising the Literacy Temperature at Churchill
- Want to motivate the kids - Student of the week, posters with what teachers and students of the week are reading - trying to heighten visibility.
- Timberwolves talk top titles - selecting a student from every grade to do a book review. The student is pulled and interviewed, and then they are working with broadcast club to help the whole school see the book review.
- Kids who are reading at home - it helps their mental health, emotional health, they make more money long term, test better, etc.
- Want help with raising the awareness and conversation around reading at home.
- Starting 11/21 - Drop everything and read
  - Kicks off 40 day reading adventure log. - Parents need to write the date of every day they've read.
- Reading around the world - tracking minutes around the world - transferring minutes to miles.
- Reported that PTA would love to have mystery readers back - it was reported to all teachers and all grade levels.
- Videos are going out that include teachers reading books that students and families can watch.
- Looking for 8 volunteers for two hours a month during the school day - help support teachers with giving students missing tests and other makeup work for students who are absent. - Look for SignUp genius to sign up for slots.

- Budget - District charged us for 3 custodians for the play - historically we've been under charged (only for 1) but that will no longer be happening. Be sure to check with the district when planning the budget for your event so you know what to expect.

## **Treasurer – Lindsey Hu**

- Cash position as of 10/30
  - \$70302.51, \$50,302.51 after \$20,000 in reserves
  - The auditor made recommendations to put \$20,000 in an account that makes more money in interest. - Going to investigate more and see what the options are.
- We have brought in \$39K of our \$77K budget this year
  - Sitting in good shape to hit our budget.
- Used \$18K of the projected \$81K in expenses
- Exceeded income in Member Services
- Run-A-Thon came in under budget for expenses and over budget for income
- Remember to use the tax exempt certificate for purchases - we have accounts with Amazon and Walmart
- We now have Zelle instead of Venmo
